Horses entered prior to closing date of **April 20, 2024** will receive the early registration discount of \$25 applied to your bill.

Entries will be considered late and occur a late fee of \$25 after noon the Monday preceding first day of show
(Monday April 1, 2024/Monday April 8, 2024)

There will be no refunds of online deposits/ stalls will be billed and charged if in the event you scratch a horse due to inability to show after closing date of horse show Substituting a scratched horse will not receive penalty or late fee.

COGGINS AND VACCINATION RECORDS:

All animals must have current valid Coggins test on file with show office (copy machine available in show office) dated within less than a year of competition. Vet records of current vaccinations must be provided as well. At Federation licensed competitions horses, more than 7 months of age, entering the grounds must be accompanied by documentation of Equine Influenza Virus and Equine Herpes Virus (Rhinopneumonitis) vaccinations within six months prior to entering the stables. Horses not in compliance with this rule may be required to leave the competition grounds upon request by Competition Management. SEE GR844 for further information.

STABLING/GROUNDS FEE:

Perm. stabling of 260 stalls w/ dirt floors. Stalls are approx. 10x10 w/doors. Bedding will be available and may be charged to your account. Stabling is available on a first-come, first-served basis. Stall fees will be charged and will not be refunded if an entry is scratched after closing date of show. Stalls will be **\$250/week**

Stall reservations must be **EMAILED to SARAH JACKSON at sjackson9136@gmail.com**

Without prior arrangements, stabling will not be available until 10:00am on Monday prior to show.

A Grounds Fee of **\$50.00** - for the week of the show - will be charged for each horse brought onto the grounds **for any reason** and not in a stall (copy of coggins, vaccination records must be on file with show office along with a signed entry blank). All entries will pay either a stall or grounds fee. **REMINDER** that all horses must wear a show issued BACK # anytime out of their stall.

USEF/USHJA CREDENTIALS AND MEASUREMENT CARDS

All participants must present to the show secretary current USEF and USHJA membership cards or copies thereof. Current valid memberships, safesport certification, amateur certification and measurement cards for Junior Hunters and Pony Hunters must be presented to the horse show secretary before numbers will be issued. No numbers will be issued without current USEF/USHJA memberships. Horses and ponies without a current valid measurement card issued by USEF will be measured by the horse show steward. Measurements will be conducted on Friday's at 10:00am or by special arrangement.

USHJA HORSE REGISTRATION

All horses competing in Federation non-breed restricted licensed competitions with hunter, hunter breeding, jumper and hunter seat equitation classes (exception: opportunity, academy, exhibition, walk-trot and lead line entries) must be properly registered with USHJA.

NON-SHOWING HORSE FEE

A non-showing fee of **\$75.00** + office fee will be charged for each horse or pony stabled on the grounds but not showing. Non-showing horses must pay USEF drug fee and complete and sign an entry blank with the horse show secretaries. Any horses that come on property without proper paperwork and a signed entry blank on file will be charged \$100.00 for non-compliance of the rules!

HORSE SHOW OFFICE

The Horse Show Office will be open by noon the day prior to the schooling for processing entries. The office will open 1 hour prior to the start of the show each day. No numbers will be issued without an open check or credit card filed with the show secretaries. No Exceptions. All entries will be charged a \$100 office fee which covers unlimited adding/scratching; medic fees.

RV PARKING

RV Parking is available at a rate of **\$160.00** for the entire show or any portion of the show. Space is limited. RV spots must be reserved with **SARAH JACKSON at sjackson9136@gmail.com** or 440-413-1147. RV Registration must be announced in show office upon arrival. Electric and water provided at spots, pump-out will be at the responsibility of the RV owner, a local pump-out name and number is provided in office.

CLASSES

Management reserves the right to limit entries, alter courses; prohibit or disqualify exhibitors; change, cancel, limit or combine classes at its discretion to compensate for excessive or inadequate entries or due to acts of nature, without claim for damages.

SCHOOLING AND WARM-UP:

ALL horses must be entered with paperwork completed/on file with show office prior to schooling. **SHOW OFFICE ISSUED BACK #s MUST BE WORN** AT ALL TIMES THE HORSE IS OUT OF HIS STALL. Hacking/Hand walking in the hunter rings will be allowed up to approximately 45 min before official showtime (weather pending). No flatting in the jumper ring at any time after schooling day unless otherwise specified with management. **THERE WILL BE NO SCHOOLING (jumping) IN THE RINGS ON THE MORNINGS OF SHOW DAYS.**

SHARPS CONTAINERS

Sharps containers will be provided in all barns. Competition Management may fine any individuals including trainers, owners, exhibitors, or their agents up to \$100 for improper disposal of needles or other sharp disposable instruments per USEF rules.

OFFICIALS

The show committee reserves the right to substitute a show official in the event of failure of an advertised show official to attend this show or perform his/her duties.

PROPER ATTIRE

It is the tradition of the show ring that riders and drivers and handlers be correctly attired for all classes and that horses be properly presented. All riders must wear properly fitting, "approved" protective headgear while riding in the designated schooling and exercising areas, the show ring, and while mounted anywhere on the competition grounds. Harness must be secured and properly fitted. Any rider violating this rule at any time must immediately be prohibited from further riding until his headgear is properly in place. Proper attire will be required in all Classics.

FOOTING AND ARENA SIZES

All show and warm up rings are made of all-weather footing of sand and limestone screenings. North ring – 112'x215', South ring – 120'x224', Jumper ring – 130'x250'.

HUNTER AND JUMPER CHAMPIONSHIPS

Hunter Championships & Jumper Championships will be awarded on the basis of points won in classes throughout the section. 1st=10 pts, 2nd=6pts, 3rd=4pts, 4th=2pts, 5th=1pt, 6th=1/2 pt.

All Rated Hunter sections will be combined as necessary according to current USEF rules.

TROPHIES, RIBBONS AND PRIZE MONEY

A trophy and ribbons 1st – 8th will be awarded in all classes unless otherwise specified. **Prize money will be paid to exhibitor by check and mailed within 30 days.** Please make sure current address and social security numbers are on file with show office. Prize money will not be processed if a social security number is not on file. **ADD-BACK PRIZE MONEY:** add-back money is paid to 6th place, unless noted in class specs \$10.00 from each entry will go into "the pot" for each class and is divided as follows; 1st-50% 2nd-25% 3rd-10% 4th-5% 5th-5% 6th-5%

COURTESY CIRCLE, JUMP ORDERS AND A "CLOCK ON THE GATE"

A dotted line may be put into effect at Management's discretion. A rotating jump order will be established and posted for all classics. All horses must be ridden in the posted order. **If management deems that unnecessary delays have become a problem, a 3-minute clock will be placed on the in-gate of the problem ring. After time has expired, the class in progress will end.**

DOGS

Germantown has a strict "Leash Law", and unleashed dogs are subject to impoundment and their owners fined. The horse show will additionally fine any owner of a loose dog found in any of the rings. Fine is \$100 for the first incident. Second incident will result in animal being banned from the grounds. **ABSOLUTELY NO EXCEPTIONS!!**

JOGGING

Unless otherwise stated jogging for all classes will result in a trot circle at end of round.

NIGHT WATCH/LIGHTS: A FEE OF \$10/ horse will be charged each week. Night watch will do regular circulation of the stabled horses starting schooling day of the show through Sun morning... at least every other aisle of lights will be turned off between the hours of 11PM and 5AM in accordance with USEF rules. Lights are located at the end of each barn if you need to turn on due to emergency situations during those hours.

RESPONSIBILITY

Neither WTHJA., the manager, his employees or any other employee of the show will be responsible for any article of any kind or nature that may be lost, destroyed or stolen, nor liable for any injury sustained to horse, exhibitors, spectators or employees of exhibitors. The foregoing shall be included as a condition of entry. **WARNING:** Under Tennessee Law, an equine professional is not liable for an injury to or the death of a participant in equine activities resulting from the inherent risks of equine activities, pursuant to Tennessee Code Annotated, title 44, chapter 20. 44-20-103. Limitation on liability for injury or death of participant Except as provided in §44-20-104, an equine activity sponsor, an equine professional, or any other person, which shall include a corporation or partnership, shall not be liable for an injury to or the death of a participant resulting from the inherent risks of equine activities. Except as provided in §44-20-104, no participant or participant's representative shall make any claim against, maintain an action against, or recover from an equine activity sponsor, an equine professional, or any other person for injury, loss, damage, or death of the participant resulting from any of the inherent risks of equine activities.

MOTORIZED VEHICLE STATEMENT

Minors who do not have a valid driver's license which allows them to operate a motorized vehicle in the state in which they reside will not be permitted to operate a motorized vehicle of any kind, including, but not limited to, golf carts, motorcycles, scooters, or farm utility vehicles, on the competition grounds of licensed competitions. Minors who have a valid temporary license may operate the above described motorized vehicles as long as they are accompanied by an adult with a valid driver's license. The parent/legal guardian or individual who signs the entry blank as a parent or guardian of a minor operating a motorized vehicle in violation of this rule are solely responsible for any damages, claims, losses or actions resulting from that operation. Violations of this rule will be cause for penalties against those responsible for the child committing the offense. Wheelchairs and other mobility assistance devices for individuals with disabilities are exempt from this rule. The unsafe use of personal electronic transport devices, as determined by the competition officials and management in their sole discretion, that do not require a driver's license to operate, including but not limited to segways, hover boards, and single wheeled scooters is prohibited on competition grounds. Operating such devices in areas where people gather may be deemed "unsafe use" if there is a risk of harm to others. If the operator of the device is a minor, the parent/legal guardian or individual who signs the entry blank as a parent or guardian of a minor operating the device in violation of this rule is accountable and may be subject to penalties. Wheelchairs and other mobility assistance devices for individuals with disabilities are exempt from this rule.

USEF MEMBERSHIP STATEMENT

Eventing Competitions at the Modified Level or above, Combined Driving Competitions at the Advanced Level, Dressage Competitions, Endurance Rides and Vaulting Competitions: (See GR828.4 of the Federation rules). Life, senior active and junior active members shall be eligible to participate in all classes at Regular Competitions, Eventing Competitions at the Modified Level or above and Combined Driving Competitions at the Advanced Level, Dressage, Reining and Vaulting Competitions and Endurance Rides. A non-member may participate as a handler, rider, driver, owner, lessee, or agent, at Regular Competitions, Eventing Competitions, Dressage Competitions, Reining Competitions and Combined Driving Competitions upon payment of a Show Pass fee. Participants in the following classes are exempted from the Requirements of this rule: 1) leadline; 2) exhibitions; 3) games and races; 4) classes for 4-H members; 5) walk trot (exception: Friesian performance FR231) and academy classes (academy classes are classes limited to horses used regularly in a lesson program); 6) USDF introductory level tests, pas de deux and quadrille classes; 7) NRHA Endorsed Reining Competitions. 8) Opportunity classes, 9) citizens of other nations who have proof, in English, of current membership in good standing of their own National Federation, 10) USEA beginner novice division; and 11) assistant handlers in Dressage Sport Horse Breeding classes.

FEDERATION ENTRY AGREEMENT

By entering a Federation-licensed Competition and signing this entry blank as the Owner, Lessee, Trainer, Manager, Agent, Coach, Driver, Rider, Handler, Vaultor or Longeur and on behalf of myself and my principals, representatives, employees and agents, I agree that I am subject to the Bylaws and Rules of The United States Equestrian Federation, Inc. (the "Federation") and the local rules of Springtime in Dixie/Springtime Encore (the "Competition") I agree to be bound by the Bylaws and Rules of the Federation and of the competition. I will accept as final the decision of the Hearing Committee on any question arising under the Rules, and agree to release and hold harmless the competition, the Federation, their officials, directors and employees for any action taken under the Rules. I represent that I am eligible to enter and/or participate under the Rules, and every horse I am entering is eligible as entered. I also agree that as a condition of and in consideration of acceptance of entry, the Federation and/or the Competition may use or assign photographs, videos, audios, cable - casts, broadcasts, internet, film, new media or other likenesses of me and my horse taken during the course of the competition for the promotion, coverage or benefit of the competition, sport, or the Federation. Those likenesses shall not be used to advertise a product and they may not be used in such a way as to jeopardize amateur status. I hereby expressly and irrevocably waive and release any rights in connection with such use, including any claim to compensation, invasion of privacy, right of publicity, or to misappropriation. The construction and application of Federation rules are governed by the laws of the State of New York, and any action instituted against the Federation must be filed in New York State. See GR908.4

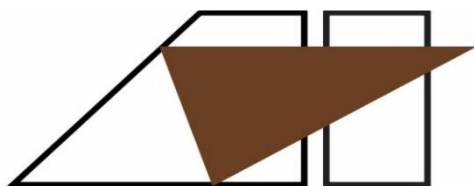

(**"USEF Event" or "USEF Events"**); I, for myself, and on behalf of my spouse, children, heirs and next of kin, and any legal and personal representatives, executors, administrators, successors,, and assigns, hereby agree to and make the following contractual representations pursuant to this Agreement (the **"Agreement"**):

A. **RULES AND REGULATIONS:** I hereby agree that I have read, understand, and agree to be bound by all applicable Federation Bylaws, rules, and policies including the USEF Safe Sport Policy and Minor Athlete Abuse Prevention Policies (MAAPP) as published at www.usef.org, as amended from time to time.

2024 ZONE 4 HANDY HUNTER CHALLENGE SPECIFICATIONS

The USHJA Zone 4 Hunter Committee has created this program to provide Handy Hunter Challenges which test skills riders and their horses might use during an enjoyable day of foxhunting combining the elements of flat and over-fences classes. A handy hunter is a horse or pony that is very easy to maneuver around a course in a ring or in the hunt field.

Different elements that might be seen in a handy hunter course include, but are not limited to, fences at the gallop, rollbacks, trot fences, a gate to open and/or close from the horse's back, etc. This class may not be appropriate for a green horse/pony or a novice rider.

The USHJA Zone 4 Committee shall fund \$1,000 for each of the Children's & Adult Amateur Handy Hunter Challenges and \$500 for the Children's Hunter Pony Handy Challenges. The USHJA Zone 4 Committee shall also fund Handy Hunter Challenges at each USHJA Zone 4 Championships to include a \$2,000 3' Children's & Adult Amateur Handy Hunter Challenge and a \$1,000 Children's Pony Hunter Handy Challenge. (The two Zone 4 Championships have a total funding of \$6,000 each.) The location of these classes will be allocated for a two year term. Participation in these classes accrues *double* points for the USHJA Zone Horse of the Year standings *double points for USEF National Horse of the Year standings*.

I. CLASS SPECIFICATIONS

A. All challenges will be held as a one round Handy Hunter class. Management may offer the Handy Hunter Challenge as an overlay to one of the classes in the respective section or as a standalone class.

B. If held as a stand-alone class, the course must have A minimum of ten (10) fences set at appropriate heights and spreads.

C. Fence Heights 1. Children's & Adult to be set at 3'

2. Small/Medium Children's Hunter Ponies to be set at 2'

3. Large Children's Hunter Pony to be set at 2'6".

D. In the 3' Children's & Adult Handy Hunter Challenge, management may choose to offer up to three (3) high option fences set three inches (3") higher with spreads not to exceed the fence height. If high options are offered, management must disclose this to exhibitors in the prize list. The course should be designed as an introduction to Handy courses, and it is encouraged that the course includes at least one (1) in-and-out, a bending line, rollback, and a trot fence. The use of natural obstacles, ditches and banks are encouraged.

E. In the Children's Pony Handy Hunter Challenge, there will be no high options. The course should be designed as an introduction to Handy courses, and it is encouraged that the course includes a bending line, a roll back turn, and a trot fence. The use of natural obstacles, ditches and banks is encouraged.

II. ELIGIBILITY

A. The rider and the owner (or recorded lessee) of the horse/pony must have USHJA Zone 4 as their home zone of record to participate and are eligible to compete under Zone 4 Specifications. B. The rider and owner must be Active members, in good standing, of both USEF and USHJA before the start of the challenges.

C. Horses/Children's Hunter Ponies must be registered with USHJA and USEF in order to participate.

III. RESTRICTIONS

A. Riders may only compete on one horse/pony per Handy Hunter Challenge, but may ride in multiple Handy Hunter Challenges at the same competition. 1. Riders may compete on one Children's Hunter Pony in each different height section offered.

B. Horses and Children's Hunter Pony may only compete in one Handy Hunter Challenges per competition.

C. Professionals are not eligible to compete in the Handy Hunter Challenges.

D. All ribbon winners from qualifying Handy Hunter Challenges during the current competition year are eligible to compete in one of the Handy Hunter Challenges held at the Zone 4 HOTY Championships. The \$2,000 Children's & Adult Amateur and the \$1,000 Children's Hunter Pony prize money per class will be funded by the USHJA Zone 4 Committee.

IV. JUDGING

A. The Handy Hunter Challenges may be officiated by one (1) or two (2) USEF “R” Hunter licensed judge(s). The judge must be in good standing with the USEF and USHJA.

B. The Challenges at the Championships must be officiated by one (1) or two (2) USEF “R” licensed hunter judges. The two judges will be seated together and give one score.

C. All judges must be Federation licensed and in good standing with the Federation and USHJA.

D. The Handy Hunter Challenges shall be judged and numerically scored on quality, movement, jumping style, handiness, manners and way of going. Pace and brilliance are to be rewarded.

E. In addition to the base score, a Handy Bonus Score consisting of zero (0) to ten (10) bonus points to each horse-and-rider combination for handiness of round must be given. If high option fences are included in the course, an Option Bonus Score consisting of one additional point for every higher height option fence jumped without knock down will also be added. The two or three scores and the sum total must be announced separately.

F. The judge or judging panel may not award the same base score to any two competitors in the class unless a competitor’s score is below the cut-off score.

G. All ties will be broken by the base score of the judge or judging panel before adding height and/or handy bonus points.

Riders in this section may enter any Equitation class and any class where otherwise eligible. Riders who compete in the Amateur Owner Hunter and/or Jumper classes may show other horses that they own in the Adult Amateur Hunters. Riders competing in the Amateur Owner 3’3” section (but not competing in the Amateur Owner 3’6” section) may ride one horse that they do not own in the Adult Amateur Hunter section.
